

Think It Not Strange

In the last issue of our regional paper we asked the question: "What Should Our Attitude Be Towards Our Lord's Imminent Return?" We considered our Lord's response to His disciples' query in Matthew 24:3 regarding "what shall be the sign of thy coming, and of the end of the world?"

The Lord responded with a litany of predictions describing what would come upon the world as a whole, and in particular what His followers would endure. He later gave the apostle John in *Revelation* a comprehensive vision regarding the last days events that would precede His return to set up His millennial kingdom.

Now for some two thousand years, men have debated just when Christ would return to RAPTURE away His Bride (the *Parousia* as it is known in Greek), especially relative to the seven years of tribulation described in Daniel and Revelation. Will His coming to rapture away His bride occur before the tribulations commence (*Pre-Tribulation*), sometime near the 3-1/2 year midpoint (*Mid-Tribulation*), just before God's great wrath is poured out (*Pre-Wrath*), or towards the end of the seven years (*Post-Tribulation*), just in time to attend the Lord's Marriage Supper.

Depending on which of these options best identifies when the rapture will occur, the amount and severity of (great) tribulation that we can expect to endure is greatly affected.

For example, we could consider such questions as: will the Church still be here on the earth when the Anti-Christ comes to full power and sets up his program; when the two witnesses of the Lord are here; when the Beast's image is setup in the temple of the Lord; when everyone must choose to take the Beast's mark or to be beheaded; etc.?

Rather than attempt to answer this question, the answer which the Lord seems to have purposely left nebulas (uncertain), we will instead consider another observation regarding what trials and tribulations we may face—one raised by the Apostle Peter:

1 Peter 4:12-13 "Beloved, think it not strange concerning the fiery trial which is to try you, as though some strange thing happened unto you: **(13)** But rejoice, inasmuch as ye are partakers of Christ's sufferings; that, when his glory shall be revealed, ye may be glad also with exceeding joy."

Peter does not see the prospect of a Christian enduring a fiery trial as something strange, but rather sees it as something that should be expected! For Christians to be "partakers of Christ's sufferings" (as we will see in the upcoming Sunday School quarterly "From Glory To Glory") is a fundamental element of our Christian walk with the Lord, the result of which is that "his glory shall be revealed," so that we "may be glad also with exceeding joy."

The Apostle Paul also addressed this matter of a Christian suffering tests, trials, and tribulations. He opened his consideration of these experiences that a Christian may endure with a question regarding "the love of Christ."

Romans 8:35-39 "Who shall separate us from the love of Christ? shall tribulation, or distress, or persecution, or famine, or nakedness, or peril, or sword? (36) As it is written, For thy sake we are killed all the day long; we are accounted as sheep for the slaughter. (37) Nay, in all these things we are more than conquerors through him that loved us. (38) For I am persuaded, that neither death, nor life, nor angels, nor principalities, nor powers, nor things present, nor things to come, (39) Nor height, nor depth, nor any other creature, shall be able to separate us from the love of God, which is in Christ Jesus our Lord."

We thus see another purpose to the trials, tests, and tribulations that we may have to endure. They certainly are used to bring God's judgment upon a wicked world, especially during the seven-year tribulation of Revelation. But they also work to demonstrate and reveal the power of the love of Christ in us to overcome all these things. Specifically, "in all these things we are more than conquerors through him that loved us."

Paul in this same chapter had asked a question regarding how we should confront the things we must endure: "If God be for us, who can be against us?" He also made an observation regarding efforts to compare our suffering with the glory to yet be revealed in us as a result of the trials, tests, and tribulations we can expect to endure:

Romans 8:31 "What shall we then say to these things? <u>If God be</u> for us, who can be against us?"

Romans 8:18 "For I reckon that the <u>sufferings</u> of this <u>present time</u> are <u>not worthy to be compared</u> with the <u>glory</u> which shall be <u>re</u>vealed in us."

Our conclusion then is that regarding these things that we "think it not strange"!

"Let us hear the conclusion of the whole matter: Fear God, and keep his commandments: for this is the whole duty of man" (Eccl. 12:13).

"Arise, shine; for thy light is come, and the glory of the LORD is risen upon thee." (Isaiah 60:1)

"Every man's work shall be made manifest: for the day shall declare it, because it shall be revealed by fire; and the fire shall try every man's work of what sort it is. (14) If any man's work abide which he hath built thereupon, he shall receive a reward" (1 Cor. 3:13, 14). We did a lot of things when I was growing up, one was butchering our own meat. When I was young we hardly ever bought meat or chicken, we raised it.

One thing I did not like was getting blood all over me although it was almost impossible not to. As soon as I could, I would go wash that blood off my body, hands, arms, anywhere it was. And depending on how long it was on me it seemed to do something to my skin, it always left a weird feeling on my skin.

Jesus' Side Is Pierced. "When Pilate saw that he could prevail nothing, but that rather a tumult was made, he took water, and washed his hands before the multitude, saying, I am innocent of the blood of this just person: see ye to it" (Matt.27:24).

Do you think just because you don't want to except something you will get off Scot free??

"The Jews therefore, because it was the preparation, that the bodies should not remain upon the cross on the sabbath day, (for that sabbath day was an high day,) besought Pilate that their legs might be broken, and that they might be taken away. Then came the soldiers, and brake the legs of the first, and of the other which was crucified with him. But when they came to Jesus, and saw that he was dead already, they brake not his legs:" (John 19:31-33).

This was Bible prophecy. That was important from a prophetic standpoint, for the scripture said, "Not a bone of Him shall be broken." You see, He was dying as a sacrificial Lamb of God. Now, they were not to offer a lamb that had any blemish or any spot or any broken bone. God didn't want an old sick lamb. You say, "Well, it's got a broken leg and it's going to die. Let's make a sacrifice unto God with this thing." God says, "No way, don't give me your hand-offs, or your cast-offs." And so, under the law they couldn't give a lamb that

had a spot or a blemish. They couldn't give a lamb that had broken bones. God knew the nature of man, how we're apt to just cast anything off on Him and save the best for ourselves. And God says, "Not so!"

And so, with Jesus, in order to fulfill the type of the sacrificial lamb, could not have a broken bone. And it was prophesied, "Not a bone of Him shall be broken." Now, had one of those soldiers just, you know, swung the sledgehammer and broke His leg anyhow, then we would have to say, "Well, we better look for another Messiah. Jesus cannot be the Messiah. His bones were broken." Oh, God was there to protect from such an accident. It takes our best for the Lord just as it took Jesus's best!

"But one of the soldiers with a spear pierced his side, and forthwith came there out blood and water" (John 19:34).

You might think that this was just to make sure Christ was dead, but you would be oh so wrong. This was for us to have a chance at the divine institution we are now in!

"And he that saw it bare record, and his record is true: and he knoweth that he saith true, that ye might believe. For these things were done, that the scripture should be fulfilled, A bone of him shall not be broken. And again another scripture saith, They shall look on him whom they pierced" (John 19:35-37).

Has that blood soaked down into you? Is the Holy Ghost trying to get you to change? How about letting the Holy Ghost polish some on you!

"Take heed therefore unto yourselves, and to all the flock, over the which the Holy Ghost hath made you overseers, to feed the church of God, which he hath purchased with his own blood." (Acts 20:28).

All due respect, we can pay all our Emergency dollars CPMA, Tabernacle Dollars for others. We can sign up dogs, cats, etc, still God knows it's not true as long as one person hasn't paid although we send in the money and are 100% in funds.

















WMB BOOST—Kandy Saunders



These things have I spoken unto you, that my joy might remain in you, and that your joy might be full. This is my commandment, That ye love one another, as I have loved you. Greater love hath no

man than this, that a man lay down his life for his friends. Ye are my friends, if ye do whatsoever I command you. Henceforth I call you not servants; for the servant knoweth not what his lord doeth: but I have called you friends; for all things that I have heard of my Father I have made known unto you. Ye have not chosen me, but I have chosen you, and ordained you, that ye should go and bring forth fruit, and that your fruit should remain: that whatsoever ye shall ask of the Father in my name, he may give it you. These things I command you, that ye love one another" (John 15:1-17).

Evangelism Boost

Perry Gillum was a former General VLB Secretary and served as manager of the Publishing House for what was then the Church at the time this article was published. We are using it here to promote Evangelism.

SEED IN STORAGE

Around the world countless thousands are perishing from malnutrition, while others are basking in the sunshine of prosperity, erecting mammoth storages for surplus commodities. There is an old missionary hymn which we often sing. "All around us souls are dying;" yes dying, hopeless without God. Can we afford to neglect our God given talent of personal evangelism?

God asked of a complacent Israel a searching question, "Is the seed yet in the barn?" Their efforts to build again the temple of the Lord had been slackened, and God compared that which they could have accomplished to unplanted, unwatered seed, alive only to itself. It could not possibly produce fruit.

Let this speak to us of the potential fruit there is in the "seed" of prayer, testimony, sacrifice, a surrendered life—of which it is in our power to plant.

The unprayed prayer can never move the hand of God. The unoffered sacrifice can never produce a fragrance that blesses others. The unspoken testimony can never influence a life for God. And the life saved only for itself, will at last be lost. "It abideth alone."

In Mark 11:24 we read, "...What things soever ye desire, when ye pray, believe that ye receive them, and ye shall have them." What power there is in believing prayer! But the prayer must be prayed! The promise must be trusted! If the seed of prayer is left stored in a dormant life of neglect, there can be no fruit. Jesus said, "Ye shall be my witnesses." How many have been saved through someone's simple testimony of God's love and Word! Prompted by the Spirit, a word in due season can save a soul from death. But the testimony we fail to give can never win a soul for Christ.

A surrendered life is one that has died to self and all selfish interests. It has been planted, utterly abandoned to the whole will of God, and therein finds its chief delight. It has fallen into the ground of selflessness and died, and now it can say, "Not I, but Christ liveth in me." That which at the time of planting seemed to be a sacrifice, has become a real source of joy, for it "bringeth forth much fruit."

Is there yet seed stored in a depository of your life? If we fail to witness to others, we are failing to sustain our own Christian experience. God's plan is that we cast our bread upon the waters as the Orientals plant their rice crops in the water—sowing the seed of prayer, testimony, sacrifice, and a surrendered life—and so come to the end of the way with sheaves for the Master. David, the man after God's own heart, once wrote: "He that goeth forth and weepeth, bearing precious seed, shall doubtless come again with rejoicing, bringing his sheaves with him." (Psalms 126:6)

If the farmer ever hopes to harvest, he must first be vitally engaged in the ground preparation for planting the seeds. Then comes the actual labor of planting the seed. Conditions may not always seem ideal for planting, but only seed sown can bear fruit. "He that observeth the wind shall not sow; and he that regardeth the clouds shall not reap." But they that sow, even in tears, "shall reap in joy."

Paul, a gospel seed sowing ambassador, says "If our gospel be hid, it is hid to them that are lost." We must not relax in the sunshine of spiritual light, while even our own loved ones perish.

Your youth group is not a private club, exclusive to a select group. Rather your youth group should be a springboard for Christian service aimed at the world. Our target should be every lost soul, may they be found at school, college, office, factory or shopping area let us sow the gospel seed and watch God honor His Word.

The Bible tells us of the activity of the New Testament Church, and they went forth witnessing everywhere telling the good news. And just as the Bible promised they increased in number.

Let us be ever abounding in the work of the Lord, continually sowing the incorruptible seed in human hearts, and remembering that the "Word of God is quick and powerful." That is, it is a living thing. A man may have two grains of corn. They are yellow in color, and both look exactly alike. Yet when planted in the ground, one reveals a live germ while the other is dead. God has so arranged His Word that when sown in human hears, it brings forth a new birth. What a heavenly feeling to personally lead a lost soul to a saving grace. Yes! We too with Paul are debtors to all men. Let's bring the gospel seed out of storage, and feed a desperate dying generation.

Therefore said he unto them, The harvest truly is great, but the labourers are few: pray ye therefore the Lord of the harvest, that he would send forth labourers into his harvest. (Luke 10:2)
