Put On the Whole Armour of God, That Ye May Be Able to Stand

In our last article "Think It Not Strange" we considered the thought expressed by Peter regarding the role that trials, tribulations, and tests play in our serving the Lord.

"Beloved, think it not strange concerning the fiery trial which is to try you, as though some strange thing happened unto you: (13) But rejoice, inasmuch as ye are partakers of Christ's sufferings; that, when his glory shall be revealed, ye may be glad also with exceeding joy" (1 Peter 4:12, 13).

Now, we will consider how we should prepare for and respond to these events that will surely come our way. Consider that when we receive severe weather alerts (tornado, flooding, hurricane, etc.), we are admonished to take appropriate steps and actions to prepare for their certainty-that we not only may ourselves survive, but that we also may be in a position to help others!

Fortunately, the Lord has left us with a "plan"-what we should do that we may be ready for whatever spiritual storm may be coming our way. Consider the admonition of Paul to the Ephesian church. He had just presented them with comprehensive instructions regarding the nature of the Church, its purpose, its organization, its operation, etc. He then finishes with instructions on the personal level. In light of what he had just shared regarding the nature of the Church, what should be our response?

Ephesians 6:10-18: "Finally, my brethren, be strong in the Lord, and in the power of his might. (11) Put on the whole armour of God, that ue may be able to stand against the wiles of the devil. (12) For we wrestle not against flesh and blood, but against principalities, against powers, against the rulers of the darkness of this world, against spiritual wickedness in high places. (13) Wherefore take unto you the whole armour of God, that ye may be able to withstand in the evil day, and having done all, to stand. (14) Stand therefore, having your loins girt about

I often get a feeling, when people share their prayer requests, that the requests relate more to surface issues than to substantive ones. Seldom do the matters at hand touch in any way the deep concerns of the King who is being addressed. Instead, most of the requests expressed seem to center on the comfort of the subject voicing it. I believe that the Church must learn to refrain from voicing requests that would sound silly were the King bodily present to hear and to respond.

If our prayers in church were actually spoken as though we were talking to Christ face to face, sooner or later a spiritual reality would begin to make itself known. This authenticity would then be caught by Sunday morning attendees, and eventually would make its way into the small praver groups in the Church, as well as into individual praver closets and private groanings before the Lord. God's people would rapidly begin to know a new and mighty confidence and boldness. When we realize that this is the King of the universe and that He has truly given us His attention, that realization results in boldness. And before we know it, we see early signs of awakening. Revival and prayer always go together. They are inseparably linked.

Some might think boldness in prayer means storming into heaven's courts demanding attention. This is not boldness in the way Christ taught it or modeled it. Instead, boldness is the picture of a confident servant coming to his master in an attitude of praise. The mindset is one of wanting most of all to serve the Lord well. Knowing God's will and doing it is the primary desire.

How the Church today languishes for this kind of praying. And in order for us to know success in this area, I believe huge adjustments must be made. I challenge all concerned Christians to examine their personal and corporate prayer lives in this light.

I suspect that the way to begin correcting this problem is in the privacy of our own times alone with Christ. And whether it's a short session or a long season of prayer-the question of importance is this: Are you conscious that Christ is there in the room with you, or are you just talking to the walls? Are you *bold* in prayer?

PRAYING BOLDLY

I have a conviction that to experience another day of awakening in the Church, leaders are going to have to model what *boldness* in prayer is all about.

Boldness regarding prayer is mentioned frequently in the New Testament, and I'm convinced that boldness for the most part is lacking in the prayers of the Church and desperately needs to be rediscovered. Never has there been awakening without God's people learning the efficacy of prayer.

The Church knows boldness when all its people pray exactly as though they were talking to Jesus face to face. The less Christians sense His presence, the less bold or confident they will be when coming before Him in prayer. This doesn't take the deductive reasoning of a genius to figure out; why put a lot into a conversation if you think the person you're talking to is not listening? Why be bold when your mind hasn't been captured by the majesty of the One to whom you come to speak? The modeling of prayer in our worship services as little more verbalizations says to observing people. "Don't expect much, folks, because we don't really sense that the King is near enough to be responding at the moment."

How would the life of the Church be transformed if we were all actually to hear Jesus say, "My subjects, I'm attentive and receptive right now to what you as a people have to say to me." with truth, and having on the breastplate of righteousness; (15) And your feet shod with the preparation of the gospel of peace; (16) Above all, taking the shield of faith, wherewith ye shall be able to quench all the fiery darts of the wicked. (17) And take the helmet of salvation, and the sword of the Spirit, which is the word of God: (18) Praying always with all prayer and supplication in the Spirit, and watching thereunto with all perseverance and supplication for all saints;"

First, Paul tells us (vs. 10-11) what we need to do to prepare for what certainly is coming our way "*be strong in the Lord, and in the power of his might. Put on the whole armour of God.*" Having taken these steps, we certainly will "*be able to stand against the wiles of the devil.*" Thus, we see that our successful preparation for what is coming (from individually for each one of us, to globally for all of us) is totally dependent upon Him: His strength, His might, and His armour. This is not the time to go looking for other solutions, our future success is totally dependent on Him.

Second, in verse 12 we are told why HE is our only hope: "we wrestle not against flesh and blood, but against principalities, against powers, against the rulers of the darkness of this world, against spiritual wickedness in high places." We are in a spiritual warfare. It may have earthly (fleshly) manifestations, but behind those outward manifestations are spiritual forces that only the Lord can overcome. In our own power and might, we are helpless! So, what are we to do?

Third, the answer to our dilemma is clear. Verse 13 reaffirms verse 11: *"Wherefore take unto you the whole armour of God, that ye may be able to withstand in the evil day, and having done all, to stand."* Again, we are admonished to take the whole armour of God (ALL of it!). Each item of that armour has a special role that it contributes to our successfully defeating the enemy.

Four, Paul enumerates in verses 14-17 a sampling of those attributes that comprise the amour of God. The listing includes: truth, righteousness, gospel of peace, faith, salvation, and Word of God. However, just having these is not enough, though. For example, many people own a Bible (maybe several Bibles) that they never read! How much good is this "sword" doing them? Many people have the "truth" but have long ago forsaken it!

Many people treat these elements of our spiritual armour in the same way that the man who received a talent from his lord (Matthew 25:14-30), and immediately chose to bury it. He still had possession of his talent, which he easily restored to his master when required. However, his otherwise neglect of that talent was viewed as *"wicked and slothful"* by his lord (vs. 26).

Simply possessing armour does not make one a warrior. Are you able to use them, effectively? You will find yourself in the same situation as David when wearing King Saul's armour: "And David girded his sword upon his armour, and he assayed to go; for he had not proved it. And David said unto Saul, I cannot go with these; for I have not proved them. And David put them off him" (1 Samuel 17:39).

For the armour of our Lord to accomplish what He has intended, we must become one with our armour—it becomes a part of us, our way of walking, talking, acting! We would not think of going forth without it!

The Lord not only gives us what we need (His whole armour), but He also will send those experiences (could include the trials that Peter spoke of) that will train us, discipline us, prepare us for the spiritual battles that will surely come our way. If we will permit Him to thus work in our lives, we will be more than sufficiently prepared for whatever spiritual battles lay ahead us.

What a blessing to learn that she came to a point in her life where she realized that something was lacking in her spiritual life. She knew that she had gotten wrapped up in social, political, and educational reform, and did not have a true love for God in her heart.

After being troubled by a dream, she went to revival meetings at a Methodist Church in New York city where she twice vainly sought the peace with God she craved, but which she finally realized during a congregational hymn of consecration while seeking God alone at the altar. Crosby stated that she then felt "flooded with celestial light."


Oh, that our loved ones would experience an encounter such as this where the Holy Ghost would show them of their desperate state, where they stand and make them aware they need God, now.

Fanny Crosby was mission-minded. She had a love for mission work. In fact, she wanted to be considered primarily as a rescue mission worker. She had a God-given talent to write hymns. Many of her hymns emerged from her mission work.

Amazing to me, she was involved in many types of mission work.

Home missions movement—Rescue missions movement—Urban rescue missions—and Prison missions.

What did she do? She visited the people. She spoke at services. She ministered through her hymns. She shared her testimony. She prayed



Our General BTI Coordinator, Brother Horton, announced the 2025 new theme of **"The Unmovable, Unchangeable, Unshakable Foundation of God"** Gods words are so profound.

There's three BTI's other than the East and West Coasts who already have their dates. Two that are being worked on, are in the Dominican Republic and the Philippines and still in the planning stage is one in Northern Mexico. Southern Mexico was just completed with 250 students; 132 of them were first term students. Let's look at the dedication and devotion of these students. Classes were held outside under a tarp, imagine, no air conditioning in mid-August the hottest month of the year with temperatures over 90 degrees and high humidity. That tells me God is moving, touching hearts and calling His children into His service.

The West Coast BTI for 2025 is scheduled for April 18-26 and East Coast BTI is scheduled for May 18-31. We need to help these instructors financially and with fervent prayer to reach as many people as possible with the whole truth. $-continued \ on \ next \ page$
